

Evening Prayer with a Service of Healing and Holy Communion May 7, 2025

The Officiant begins the service with the following sentence of Scripture: Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; let the whole earth tremble before him.

Confession of Sin

The Officiant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Officiant and People together:

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Officiant: Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. Amen.

The Invitatory and Psalter

Officiant: O God, make speed to save us.

People: O Lord, make haste to help us.

All: Glory to the Father, and to the Son,

and to the Holy Spirit:

as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen. Alleluia.

Together, all say:

O gracious Light, pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!

A Litany of Healing

Officiant Let us name before God those for whom we offer our prayers.

The people may speak the names for those they are interceding.

God the Father, your will for all people is health and salvation.

We praise and thank you, O Lord.

God the Son, you came that we might have life, and might have it more abundantly.

We praise and thank you, O Lord.

God the Holy Spirit, you make our bodies the temple of your presence.

We praise and thank you, O Lord.

Holy Trinity, one God, in you we live and move and have our being.

We praise and thank you, O Lord.

Lord, grant your healing grace to all who are sick, injured, or disabled, that they may be made whole. **Hear us, O Lord of life.**

Grant to all who seek your guidance, and to all who are lonely, anxious, or despondent, a knowledge of your will and an awareness of your presence.

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Mend broken relationships and restore to those in emotional distress, soundness of mind and serenity of spirit.

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Bless physicians, nurses and all others who minister to those who suffer, granting them wisdom and skill, sympathy and patience.

Hear us, O Lord of life.

Grant to the dying peace and a holy death; and uphold by the grace and consolation of your Holy Spirit those who are bereaved.

Hear us, O Lord, of life.

God our Savior, restore us, renew us and strengthen us.

Hear us, O Lord of life and make us whole.

Officiant May the God of love visit us in our times of trial and weakness, and raise us to newness of life, through Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Officiant: The ministry of Jesus invites us to new life with God and each other. In the laying on of hands and anointing with oil, we proclaim the good news that God desires us to be healthy and one in the body of Christ.

You are invited to other yourself, whatever your sickness of spirit, mind or body, and ask for healing and wholeness in the Name of the holy and undivided Trinity.

The ministers then lay hands upon each person and anoint them with oil. After all have been blessed, the following prayer is said:

The Almighty Lord, who is a strong tower to all who put their trust in him, to whom all things in heaven, on earth, and under the earth bow and obey: Be

now and evermore your defense, and make you know and feel that the only Name under heaven given for full health and salvation is the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

All: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with us all evermore. Amen.

Holy Communion

Communion is administered from the reserved sacrament. When the Bread and Wine are placed on the Lord's Table, then is said the following prayer.

Officiant Almighty Father, whose dear Son, on the night before he suffered, instituted the Sacrament of his Body and Blood: Mercifully grant that we may receive it thankfully in remembrance of Jesus Christ our Lord, who in these holy mysteries gives us a pledge of eternal life; and who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. **Amen.**

All persons are invited to receive the Holy Communion.

Post Communion Prayer

Officiant

Let us pray.

Gracious Father, we give you praise and thanks for this Holy Communion of the Body and Blood of your beloved Son Jesus Christ, the pledge of our redemption; and we pray that it may bring us forgiveness of our sins, strength in our weakness, and everlasting salvation.; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Officiant

May God the Father bless us, God the Son heal us, God the Holy Spirit give us strength. May God the holy and undivided Trinity guard our bodies, save our souls, and bring us safely into his heaven country; where he lives and reigns forever and ever. **Amen.**
