(Wait a moment for the people to find their place in the BCP)

All remain standing.

Father, we pray for your holy Catholic Church;

That we all may be one.

Grant that every member of the Church may truly and humbly serve you;

That your Name may be glorified by all people.

We pray for Justin, the Archbishop of Canterbury; for Michael, our Presiding Bishop; for Jennifer, our Bishop; for Brian, Debbie, Gary, Geoff, Janet, Meg, Janice, Ron, and Timothy, our clergy; for Cecily and Sharon our Licensed Lay Pastoral Care Ministers; and for all bishops, priests, and deacons;

That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments.

We pray for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

That there may be justice and peace on the earth.

Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

That our works may find favor in your sight.

Have compassion on those who suffer from any grief or trouble

That they may be delivered from their distress.

Give to the departed eternal rest;

Let light perpetual shine upon them.

We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

Let us pray for our own needs and those of others.

(Pause slightly between each bidding.)

We pray for all visitors and guests today, that they might find a warm welcome from us and encounter God's love and peace.

We remember in prayer all the men and women of our armed forces, especially those deployed in war zones, and their families; and for all troops and civilians in harm's way in regions of conflict at home and around the world.

We pray for our companion Diocese, the Episcopal Church in Navajo-land: Bishop David Bailey; and for St. John the Baptizer Episcopal Church, Montezuma Creek, Utah, and in our diocesan cycle of prayer, we pray for the life, work and ministry of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Tombstone.
